Introduction

- Scientific Literature
- Urban fieldwork in environmental risks, housing issues, urban insecurity (CCS, MX, BBAA, SP)
- 1- Outward thinking: informality tells us about social order (Analytical category)
- 2- Backward thinking: informality tells us about the way social sciences represent society (Epistemology)
- 3- Politicization: we must be cautious with informality as it entails different worldviews regarding both societies we are observing and our practices of social scientists.

I- Outward Thinking Analytical category

- 1- Functionalist explanation: Informality is constitutive of societies, economies, right and justice, administration... *It makes things work*
- 2- Structural explanation: Informality is part of social ordering, it is normative and constitutive of hierarchies and inequalities. *It gives sense*

II- Backward Thinking Heuristic device

- 1- The way we talk about informality is performative and uncovers ideological principals
- 2- The rising of informality is consistent with a rearranging modernity (deregulation, individualization, self-responsibility...): it has political contents.

Informality is

- * A way of to <u>question modern societies</u> in crisis, and to refresh social sciences approaches / methods / perspectives... BUT
- * The criticism that the study of informality entails must be reflexive: it needs to be <u>situated and politicized</u>

III- From reflexivity to politicization of informality assessment through social sciences

1- Informality is one of the many ways to question a rearranging Modernity.

2- Informality invites us to consider localism, relativism and cultural aspects... with caution because of potential drifts.

CONCLUSION

INFORMALITY:

- Between the emancipating practices of the many little ants
- And another arena a so called rearranging Modernity – for society to work (and for its understanding)
- = As heuristic device, informality is plural. We acknowledge that, and we must figure significant differences out of these many worldviews.
