Roger Collins, « The ‘‘autobiographical’’ works of Valerius of Bierzo: their structure and purpose », in *Los Visigodos. Historia y civilización. Antigüedad y cristianismo* (Murcia) III, 1986 :

« the **apparently autobiographical** character of Valerius’s work only serves to make it more **disconcerting** to the modern reader, who expects to **share a common thought-world** with his author. To read, for example, of the Egyptian hermit Arsenius throwing stones at unwanting visitors may seem quaint or amusing, but a similar attitude expressed in Valerius’s first person narration is the more **violent and threatening** for being presented in a one to one relationship with the reader, who is thus denied his normal role of detached observer of events described in the third person. » (p. 428)

« In modern judgements on Valerius the **mask** has been mistaken for the **man**. » (p. 434)





- *Vita Malchi* : « o nihil umquam tutum apud diabolum, [...] me latentem invenit **invidia** »
- *Vita Antonii* : « et nunc nostri torquentur **invidia** atque universa crimina commovere non cessant »
- *Vita Ambrosii* : « obmutesce diabole, quia non te torquet Ambrosius, sed fides sanctorum et **inuidia** tua »
- *Vita Fructuosi* :
 - « ilico **inuidus** uir iniquus, sororis eius maritus, antiqui hostis stimulis instigatus, coram rege prostratus, surgens subripuit animum eius »
 - « antiquus hostis unde bonos cernit enitescere ad gloriam, inde peruersos per **inuidiam** rapit ad penam. Quidam namque iuvenis uesanie spiritu afflatus, immo potius inuidie igne succensus, ... ipsam bestiunculam morsibus canium interemit. »


Instructions about reading in monastic rules,

legatur. »


Main manuscripts bearing the « compilation », part 1







Date: XIth c.










Using data produced within traditional philology... Some difficulties (1)

- the manuscripts of the compilation have sometimes been discarded ;
- we need to evaluate how reliable critical editions are beforehand
 - *Vita Antonii*, collation of Madrid, BN 10007 :
 - 15780 loci
 - 1150 differences according to the editor
 - 1770 differences (+ 620 !) according to me
 - critical principles differ between editions : « Abbiam lasciato da parte quelle (*sc.* lezioni) puramente ortografiche e quelle **che non gioverebbero alla costituzione del testo** perché evidentemente errate né capaci di suggerire sotto l'errore una lezione buona » (M. Pellegrino, editor of the *Vita Ambrosii*)
- sometimes huge manuscript traditions (up to 490 manuscripts)



- highly complex stemmata (when they could be done...)






Using data produced within traditional philology... Some difficulties (2)

To solve THE problem: cut it in smaller different problems, and see if their solutions are coherent


