Is OpenStreetMap suitable for Urban Climate Studies ?



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⇒ How to assess the impact of cities on regional climate ?

- Climate models were built to assess that, such as Town Energy Balance (TEB), but they need <u>data on urban areas</u>
- Existing methodologies providing urban geographical information such as World Urban Database and Access Portal Tools (WUDAPT), using Local Climate Zone (LCZ) classification framework
 - ⇒ Problems :
 - <u>Coarse resolution</u> (e.g. 100m * 100m for LCZ)
 - No morphological and architectural descriptions

LCZs 1 to 3 are characterized by tightly packed buildings and little green space.

- · tightly packed buildings to tens of stories tall
- · concrete, steel, stone and glass construction materials
- · small diurnal temperature range

- · tightly packed buildings of 3 to 9 stories tall
- · stone, brick, tile and concrete construction materials
- · small diurnal temperature range

- · tightly packed buildings of 1 to 3 stories tall
- · concrete, steel, stone and glass construction materials
- · diurnal temperature range is medium

Research have been done to overcome these problems with MAPuCE program lead by CNRS & Meteo France :

- Open geoprocessing framework to calculate standardized urban indicators at 3 geographic scales : building, block and a Reference Spatial Unit (RSU).
- Based on a fine vector Data Base (DB) provided by the French National Geographical Institute (IGN).

⇒ New opportunities to extend the WUDAPT DB at a finest scale with <u>morphological</u>, <u>architectural</u> and <u>socioeconomic indicators</u>.

WUDAPT intends to classify the urban fabric by climate properties from homogeneous and available data at world scale.

⇒ There is a <u>need to investigate other databases</u>.

OpenStreetMap project, an opportunity for urban climate studies ?

- It has a **world coverage**
- It has, a priori, <u>spatial attributes and metrics for morphological</u> and architectural information of cities
- The database is growing steadily so we are expecting <u>more and</u> <u>more valuable information</u>



Issues

 Are OSM data suitable for these kind of urban climate studies ?

How to answer these question ?

⇒ By building a <u>methodology</u> and a <u>set of</u> <u>tools</u> to check the availability of the OSM data to feed the MApUCE geoprocessing chain and thus urban climate studies



A lot of methods and tools to qualify OSM data

Some relevant examples ... :

- GeoFabric \Rightarrow Scale of the data
- OverpassTurbo \Rightarrow No geometric statistics calculation
- OSMnx \Rightarrow Roads analysis only
- Osm analytics ⇒ No customised statistics calculation, only online
- Etc.

... that do not meet enough criteria for urban climate studies

Method





Implementation

An Open source framework, in 4 main steps :

- Query on the fly the OSM database from a country code & store the data in a <u>Multi-Dimensional Data Base</u> (MDDB),
- Compute spatial and attribute metrics on the city,
- Store the results in the MDDB,
- <u>Visualise the results from Metabase dashboard service</u> that integrates chart and map representations at different scales : time, attributes, geography.



Geoprocessing chain : data acquisition

Query on the fly the OSM database from a country code :

- Through <u>OverPass API</u>
- With a <u>dedicated library</u> that reproducing the API in <u>JAVA/Groovy langage</u>

⇒ Aims to improve the OverPass requests in Groovy

Geoprocessing chain : metrics computation

Compute spatial and attribute metrics on the country :

- Into the MBBD using <u>H2GIS</u> or <u>PostGre</u>
 <u>SQL/PostGIS</u>
- Computation are made with <u>SQL</u>
 <u>langage functions</u>

Results

Open Street Map dashboard

This dashboard checks for each French communes the consistency of the Open Street Map database for environmental studies.

It provides statistics on a set of GIS layers and their attributes.

The GIS layers are reconstructed from the OpenStreetMap relational model. They are organized according to the simple features model.

Currently statistics are only provided for the building layer and the attributes height, level and area.

Conclusion

- Get <u>specific</u> and <u>detailed</u> informations on the <u>raw data</u> for a given territory, « <u>on-the-fly</u> »
- Know if a <u>spatial analysis</u> can be carried out on a territory with regard to the <u>necessary parameters for</u> <u>specific uses</u> (urban climate studies, land-planning project, environmental acoustic studies, ...)
- A possibility to <u>interract with the OSM community</u> to get the needed information for a given territory and <u>improve</u> the world community map



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
