# Soft power – The core concept of China's foreign policy

Vision	The concept of the soft power	
American vision	"Power is seen as the ability to get others to do what they otherwise would not do" (Nye, 1991, pp. 25–26) The ability to "influence others though agenda setting, attraction or co-option" (Nye, 2004, p. 8)	
French vision	Through the use of various intercultural communications and practices, a variety of cultures, history, lifestyles, values and even ideologies could be disseminated in order to bring about a mutual understanding between different principal parts in the intercultural context (Huyghe, 2011; Martel, 2013; Tenzer, 2013).	
Chinese vision	"()whether a power resource is soft or hard depends on the feelings and perceptions of various actors in specific situations" (Zheng & Zhang, 2012, p. 21).  The "soft power with Chinese characters" (H. Wang, 1993), includes diplomatic exercises and politic domestic activities, to spread an admirable culture and ideological system.	



### Soft power & Public diplomacy

- Public diplomacy is also seen as communication engagement.
- Engagement is a channel through which organizations and publics are able to make decisions that contribute to interpersonal, organizational, community, and civic social capital (Taylor & Kent, 2014).
- Current public diplomacy practice is gradually reinforcing relationship building, relationship maintenance and narrative in order to stimulate and deepen public engagement.
  - (...) through shared value narrative and emotional appeals, to "understand, inform, engage, and influence people" (Djerejian, 2003, p. 5)
- Grand narrative plays a key role in current public diplomacy practice.



#### **Introduction: the FOCAC and China-Africa**

#### China-Africa relations:

- Aid period: "Solidarity of African brothers and sisters to fight for the liberty";
- South-South cooperation period: "to create a better world together with African brothers and friends" (Zhang, 2015, p. 314)
- Global cooperation period: "a somewhat idealistic impression of the distant partner or big brother in the East" (Whi, 2006)

# The FOCAC (Forum of China-Africa Cooperation):

- Foundation: 2000
- Objective: built a new mechanism and a new cooperation platform for China-Africa relations, which is conducive to the development and promotion of China-Africa comprehensive cooperation partnership.
- New blue print: building "an even stronger China-Africa community with a shared future" (FOCAC, 2018)

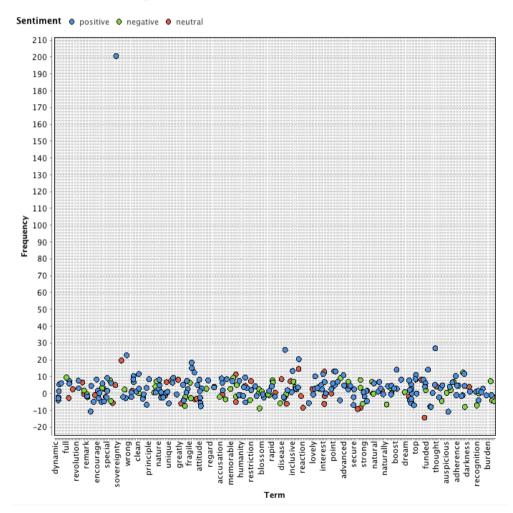


## Findings: the rhetoric of China's strategic narratives on Twitter

• Almost half of the tweets studied (46.5%) include positive connotations.

• the serial repetition of these tweets has an enumerative value that creates an accumulation effect

### Findings: Relationship-based engagement

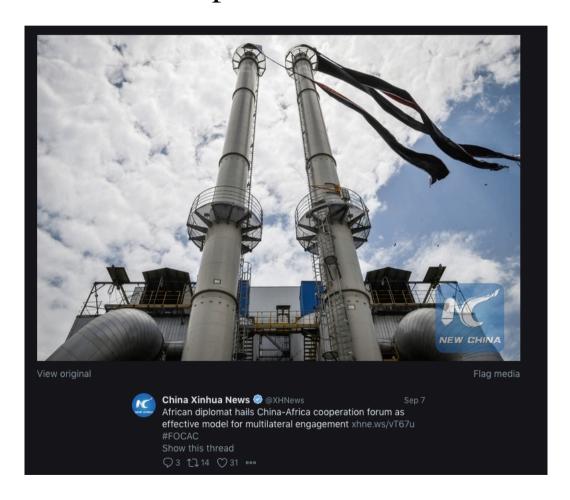
The relationship-based engagement firstly focuses on the reminder of the relationship between Sino-African political heads and people.





## Findings: Relationship-based engagement

The second model of relationship-based engagement is implanted in economic and industrial cooperation.





### Findings: Relationship-based engagement

The third relationship-based engagement appeared in the strategic narrative in people's daily life which has more implicit meaning.





#### **Conclusion**

First, due to the Chinese government's censorship in the media system, all tweets published by China's state-owned media have a positive connotation.

Second, through the rhetoric analysis of 191 tweets based on "cooperation" topic, we found Chinese media have mobilized a lot of rhetorical devices to highlight China's leading and core position in China-Africa relations in an implicit manner.

Third, through different grand narratives, Chinese media have utilized various communication forms and tools to tell China stories on Twitter.
