PACTOLS the French terminological Repository for Archaeology

The PACTOLS thesaurus is the only controlled, free, multilingual and interoperable French vocabulary for archaeology. It is one of the tools of the Federation and Resources on Antiquity (Frantiq) of the CNRS that has contributed to the Indexed Collective Catalogue for more than thirty years.

An extensive programme was launched in 2017 and supported by the MASA (Memory of Archaeologists and of Archaeological Sites) Consortium of the TGIR HumaNum to consolidate its structure and reorganise its terminology for better clarity and use on a wider scale than just in libraries. The goal is to make of Pactols a truly thematic repository for all involved in archaeology and a hub of disciplinary metadata interconnected with the semantic web.

Sustained and controlled by a community

- 40 libraries from the Frantiq network analyse academic literature in the **Indexed Collective Catalogue**
- experts and teams of specialists control the choices of vocabulary and participate in the updating of the thesaurus
- 1 Working Group manages the thesaurus on a regular basis
- 1 Steering Committee consolidates the structure and enriches the vocabulary. This Committee is supported by the MASA Consortium
- FRANTIQ represents the CNRS on the Curators Committee of the BackBone Thesaurus of **DARIAH**
