


Location of Marseille on the French Mediterranean coast. (Google Earth capture)

Red color: Massilia and its territory during the Early Roman Empire period.








Plan and satellite view of the actual Vieux-Port










Map of the harbour during the roman period ($1^{st} - 4^{th}$ c. AD).













Plan of the roman port infrastructures found on the « Jules-Verne » site (C. Louail et D. Delpalillo, 2004)













Plan of the Roman Docks base on results of recents surveys (1986) (Drawing H. Tréziny, 2005)














South-North section, survey DY 09 (R. Guéry, 1992 and 1998)




Restitution of the paleo-rivage of the north-est port sector – Hellénistic period (M. Bouiron, 2001)




Axonometry from restitution of the cofferdam (R. Guéry, 1992)








