Psycho-collocations?

Collocation made up of N + predicate, where N is a body part (or related), and the whole refers to an emotion (or related)

- J. Matisoff 1986, Hearts and minds in South-East Asian languages and English: an essay in the comparative lexical semantics of psycho-collocations
- A. Vittrant 2013, Psycho-collocational expressives in Burmese
- A. Vittrant and J. Watkins (eds) 2019. The Mainland Southeast Asia Linguistic Area

"We define a **psycho-collocation** [...] as a polymorphemic expression referring as a whole to a mental process, quality, or state, one of whose constituents is a **psychonoun**, i.e. a noun with explicit psychological reference (translatable by English words like HEART, MIND, SPIRIT, SOUL, TEMPER, NATURE, DISPOSITION, MOOD). The rest of the psi-collocation contains morphemes (usually action verbs or adjectives) that complete the meaning. This element we call the **psychomate**." (JAM 1986, 9)


Kiranti languages

Kiranti subgroup

Sino-Tibetan/ Trans-Himalayan

Approx. 30 languages, Eastern Nepal

Thulung: 2000 speakers





Thulung case marking

Person-based ergative marking:

- ergative marker –ka on A for 3rd person pronouns and nouns
- no marking on A for 1st and 2nd persons

Animacy-based object marking:

• object marker — lai (glossed DAT) on human (as well as some highly animate non-human) P & R/G

Thulung verbal agreement

Polypersonal indexing language: subject and object

Two sets of person indexes: intransitive which index just S, and transitive which index combinations of A and P (glossed A>P) with distinct sets for non-past and past

gu-ka go-lai jal-**ŋi**

3SG-ERG 1SG-DAT strike-3sG>1sG

'He strikes me.'

gu-ka khlea jal-u

3sg-erg dog strike-3sg>3sg

'He strikes the dog.'



Thulung N+V complex predicates

Thulung has complex predicates made up of Noun + Verb

Function as a semantic unit, except that some types of material can be inserted between the two elements: negation marker, discourse markers

bo:bop-ka wo thama ne memsaka **na:le**

owl-ERG also later TOP like.that **N.taunt**

me-**dat**-ŋi rwak-ta

NEG-**v.taunt**-2SG>1SG say-3SG.PST

'The owl also later said "Do not taunt me like that".'

An important subset of these are **body part* + V constructions**, of which 35 found

Argument frames

Typical in South Asia to code experiencers as dative subjects:

mə-lai bhok lag-jo

1SG-DAT hunger feel-3SG.PST

'I am hungry.'

Experiencer is dative-marked (*ma-lai*); subject of the verb (*lag-jo, NB* 3sg indexation) is the experience noun (*bhok*).

Instead, in Kiranti languages, the experiencer is often the possessor of the subject — 'possessive of experience' (Bickel 1997) — and the subject of the verb is the experience noun.

a-tshoktso bnk-ta
1SG.POSS-anger arise-3SG.PST
'I am angry [My anger has arisen] .'

[Bickel 1997. The possessive of experience in Belhare. In Bradley, ed. Tibeto-Burman languages of the Himalayas]



Looking at the psychocollocations I've collected, picture is considerably more complicated:

body part as the S (about half examples)

body part as the P (about half example)

body part as the A (just one example)

body part as an oblique argument (just two examples)

Body part as oblique

[Other example also locative, but different marker: horizontal locative]



- psycho-mates (i.e. verbs) that are intransitive : body part is S
- psycho-mates that are transitive: body part is P (most frequent scenario), A (one example), or Oblique (2 examples)



Possessive marked experiencer

Very frequent construction, regardless of type of argument (S, P, A, or oblique)

nn: khu:mu [mind steal], 'tricked, deceived'

oram-ka ham lwa rwak-saka **gu-ka a:ma nл:**

DEM-ERG what talk say-CVB 3SG-ERG 1SG.POSS mind

khu-iru

steal-3SG>3SG.PST

I was deceived by him saying things [He stole my mind by saying things]

26 of the psychocollocations occurred with a possessively-marked experiencer; 9 did not

I initially thought it was random, but in fact seems not....



Subtypes of psycho-collocations

Taxonomy from Matisoff 1986

i. Intellection and attitudes towards experience:

intellection: thinking, discriminating, understanding, knowing, concen-

trating, focussing the attention (or not), awareness, ima-

gination

volition: will-power, decision, indecision, desire, intention

experiential attitudes: belief, doubt, hope, commitment

ii. Qualities of character, traits of personality:

Psi-collocations of this type refer to aspects of a person's NATURE, CHARACTER, DISPOSITION, TEMPERAMENT, or PERSONALITY — i.e. qualities that are felt to be quasi-permanent, not subject to change from moment to moment.

Into this category fall concepts like STINGY, HARD-HEARTED, GULLIBLE, WIMPY, SERENE, GENEROUS, OPEN-MINDED, etc.

iii. Emotions, feelings, moods:

These collocations express feelings, moods, or states of mind (cf. French états d'esprit) which are temporary or momentary, evoked by a particular mental or physical event.

Here we place affective concepts like SAD, HAPPY, WORRIED, ANGRY, AFRAID, SATISFIED, RESTLESS, etc.



Intellection subtype (8 collocations/35)

sem baja bnmu [hair floor get.up], 'make a decision collectively to help others'

del-ram khotle **sem baja bл-mri-ma** lamdi

village-ABL all hair floor get.up-3PL.PST-CONJ road

dha-mri

dig-3PL>3SG.PST

'Everyone from the village **decided to come together** to help and they dug a road.'

Other intellection psycho-collocations: feel like [mind be], desire/decide [mind do], be interested [mind pay !], know/share someone's secrets [intestines wash], be able to do things [inside-LOC start], decide [mind heart meet]



Qualities of character subtype (2 collocations/35)

si dummu [mouth beat], 'talk a lot of hot air'

Only two of this subtype:

talking a lot but not doing much; thieving (Iwa thn:mu [hand stretch])



Emotion subtype (25 collocations/35)

'When youngest daughter went to play and beat everyone, she came back and everyone (in the family) was proud.'



Patterns correlating subtypes with construction:

Emotions: experiencer coded as POSS

Intellection: no POSS (no experiencer!)

[Qualities of character: ? 1 POSS, other not)

Intellection psycho-collocations often involve a complement clause, which is usually expressed as a participially-marked clause, which modifies the body part:

nn: bomu, [mind do], 'decide'

gu hon-laηka bik-pa **nn**: ne **bu:-ru**

3SG there-ABL come-ACT.PTCP **mind** TOP **do**-3SG>3SG.PST

'He **decided** to come from over there'



Other intellection with participial complement clauses

nn: bumu [mind be] 'feel like'

meram khom-ra lʌk-pa **nʌ: bu**-ma:la

DEM place-LOC go-PTCP mind be-COND

'If [you] feel like going to that place...'

nn: them ghremmu [mind heart meet] 'decide'

dhamu-laŋ khomda-num bi:-sa-ri rwakpa **nл:**

Emotion subtype semantics

Predominantly **negative** emotions conveyed

sadness, shame, dissatisfaction, covetousness, grudge, generosity, deception, discouragement, motivation, fatigue, excitement, overwhelmed, pressure on time, embarrassment, anxiety, disappointment, pity, satisfaction, jealousy, pride, sense of freedom from toil

Negative:

Expressions both metaphors and literal

bui nemu [head hurt], 'feel overwhelmed, overworked'

tsikhli solmu [intestines wash] 'know someone's secrets and behavior; divulge someone's secrets'

Other means of expressing emotions

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Other N+V 'emotive predicates' (Ebert 1994 term) nim, 'fear'; brem, 'laziness' + lu:mu, 'come.out' tshoktso, 'anger' + bn:mu 'arise' or + phn:mu 'raise'

Lexical verbs for expression of emotions:

bhurmu 'get angry', ni:mu 'fear', bhre:mu 'be lazy', bhrn:simu 'enjoy, be happy', dwa:mu 'love, like', ghrammu 'be disgusted by', murmu 'suspect, accuse', nemu 'be ill, hurt', phnmu 'argue, quarrel' gersi dwa:mu 'feel happy' (N+V)

Nepali loans:

khusi 'happy', la:dzi 'embarassed, ashamed, shy', both + lu:mu 'feel'

[Adversative construction: calqued from Nepali (negative purpose)]





Focus here on the more **metaphorical body part expressions**, of which 35 were found, even though "not so common in Kiranti." (Bickel 1997, 145)

Presumably incomplete list provided here for Thulung: more work going through corpus with an eye towards identifying additional psycho-collocations—more body types, more collocations, different types of expressions

Surprisingly little work, given the potential interest, on the topic at the level of Kiranti in terms of semantics and morphosyntax:

Bickel, focused on possessive of experience, with little on metaphorical psycho-collocations.

Grammars of Bantawa (Doornenbal 2009) and Yakkha (Schackow 2015) have a bit more, so areal study (maybe) possible.



Other means of expressing emotions exist, so psycho-collocations do not fit MSEA pattern in this respect.

Vittrant 2013 describes psycho-collocations (and elaborate expressions) as part of the expressive toolbox of Burmese.

In South Asian languages, 'expressives' tends to be used for ideophones (incl. onomatopeia), which are marked by morphophonological patterns (incl. reduplications)

Some thought needed at level of Tibeto-Burman/Trans-Himalayan family about what we are calling 'expressives'
